Briefing Sheet

COLOUR OF BUOYS AND FLAGS

All buoys and flags as per Sunday Race Briefing sheet

Please note: The display of a medical flag by any competitor in a race will result in a Red Flag situation.

All boats may launch and retrieve from the Crown Hotel boat ramp. All boats must carry adequate fuel for all races.

TIMETABLE

8:00 Breath Testing at Crown Hotel Jetty (**SRA Membership Card and skier helmets must be presented**)

9:00 Disabled & Under 10 Years Race (1 Lap)

START PROCEDURE

Start procedure will be a deep water grid start with Disabled the first Class to start. Starter will be positioned on the Crown Hotel Jetty. Start Line will be a line drawn across the river between Susan Island and the Start/Finish Buoy. Pole 1 will be closest to Susan Island.

- Boats will be notified of 10 minutes to start.
- Australian Flag and Green Flag will be raised with 5 minutes to start
- Green Flag will be dropped with 30 seconds to start (skiers to enter the water). NOTE Skiers are not to enter the water prior to Green Flag being dropped.
- Australian Flag will be dropped on Go. The Australian Flag and the Green Flag will be raised again and the above procedure will be repeated. If for any reason a start is to be delayed a red flag will be shown. When the red flag is dropped this will show 3 minutes until race start
- NO POWER TURNS ARE PERMITTED.
- After 2 failed starts – move from the Start Area

COURSE

- PROCEED UPSTREAM – Remaining on the left hand side of the river.
- LITTLE ISLAND – You will pass between the Big Island (on your left) and the Little Island (on your right). After passing the Little Island (on your right), do not push over to the right as shallow water exists.
- TOP TURN BUOY (Large Square Orange Buoy) – Located approximately 2 kilometres upstream. A small orange lead in buoy will be positioned approximately 100 metres before the turn buoy.
- Approaching the end of Susan Island turn there will be 2 white buoys on the right of the channel. Keep these on your right as shallow water and rocks exist.

- PROCEED DOWNSTREAM ensuring you remain RMS regulation distances from all banks and structures. You will come across an orange buoy approximately two thirds the way down the island, this must be kept on your left. When you approach the bottom end of the island do not cut the point as a sandbar runs out for approximately 250 metres.
- BOTTOM TURN BUOYS (3 Buoy Turn) – A small orange lead in buoy will be positioned approximately 100 metres before the first of a 3 buoy turn at the bottom end of the course.
- A Course Boat will be located mid-course halfway between the bottom turn and the start / finish line. This boat will display a Yellow Caution Flag should any boats or excessive wash still be present in the start area.
- WHITE SAFETY BUOYS – Off the Grafton bank – Must be kept on your right.
- FINISH BUOY – Must be kept on your left. Proceed well past the finish line and come to a stop on the right hand side of the course. NO POWER TURNS PERMITTED IN THIS AREA.
- A course boat will notify all boats in the finish area when the course is clear for boats to return to the bank.
- BOATS UNABLE TO FINISH may return to the Start Bank under their own power (if possible) following the course being opened by the Chief Judge. Boats unable to return to the Start Bank under their own power are to remain on the nearest bank until the end of racing.
